**CARTER, C. J.**

Christopher George Wiley initiated this suit while an inmate in the custody of the Louisiana Department of Public Safety and Corrections. Wiley now appeals a judgment of the district court dismissing his claims against the Parish Prison with prejudice, and dismissing all of his other claims without prejudice at his cost.

After careful consideration of the entire record, we agree with the district court that this is a “prisoner suit” to which the Louisiana Prison Litigation Reform Act applies. The Commissioner’s June 22, 2005 report, adopted by the district court in its July 21, 2005 judgment, thoroughly and adequately sets for the procedural background of this case and analyzes the issues presented. After thoroughly reviewing the entire record, we find no error and affirm the district court’s judgment in accordance with Rule 2-16.2A(5) of the Uniform Rules of Louisiana Courts of Appeal. All costs of this appeal are assessed to Christopher George Wiley.

**AFFIRMED.**
